The due date for the application is February 29, 2016 and must include a copy of your 2014 income tax return and 2015 W2's.

From the Pastor's Pen

I want to let all of you know that the committee which I have assembled for our next fundraising initiative for the Roman Catholic Foundation of Eastern Missouri, Beyond Sunday, is a great group of people. Our committee members are Carol Eaton, Mike Lukachick, Janie McCormick, Paula Pace and Tom Willette. The Roman Catholic Foundation of Eastern Missouri included in the Beyond Sunday effort by the Archdiocese of St. Louis will receive 60% of what we collect. The other 40% will be given back to the parishes for repairs to their current structures so that they will be viable in the years to come. The goal for St. Joseph Parish is \$305,000. Forty percent of the funds raised toward our goal will be given back to the parish for partial funding of repairs: tuck pointing of the exterior of the church, painting of the church interior, flooring repairs to the parish hall underneath the church, repair of the tapestry in the sanctuary, and new carpet for the church.

St. Anne Parish has a goal of \$65,000. Forty percent of the funds raised would be used for repairs that would be needed at the parish in the future.

One of our challenges is to meet the goals set by the Archdiocese based upon ordinary donations to the church as of December 31, 2013. We are asking people to prayerfully consider a sacrificial gift to Beyond Sunday, after prayer and meditation, on what they can do. We will do the best that we can.
