There are 4 parts to the Mass: 1) *Introductory Rites* (entrance, greeting, penitential act, Glory to God, collect), 2) *Liturgy of the Word* (readings, homily, profession of faith, universal prayer), 3) *Liturgy of the Eucharist* (presentation of the gifts, Eucharistic prayer, Lord's Prayer, sign of peace, Communion, prayer after Communion), and 4) *Concluding Rites* (announcements, blessing, dismissal).

Deacon's Corner

“He indeed died for all, so that those who live might no longer live for themselves but for him.” How is this done? What does this look like?

We often want to hold onto things, whether it is time, as in the past or the physical, as in a person or personal object but, as many find out; both are fleeting, here today and gone tomorrow. But Jesus offers us something that is beyond time and space, beyond the material world, what he offers, how he lived, what he desires for us is immortal, timeless, lacking of that which makes up the material object and therefore can be considered priceless.

How is living for others done? It is done by first letting go of the desire to accumulate, to hold onto that which cannot be held onto. Oh, it is not that simple you might say, Jesus would say otherwise. It is a matter of choice.
