St. Joseph Church – History

On October 29, 1916, Archbishop John J. Glennon came to Bonne Terre from St. Louis for the dedication of the Church. The Saturday before the dedication, Father Sevcik asked Mr. Hritz to erect the cross on top of the dome of the belfry. The cross slips over a 6x6 cedar post. The cross is 11 feet, 9 inches tall and 9 feet 6 inches across. Mr. Hritz asked Father if he didn't think it was a bit too windy to try to put the cross up. Nevertheless, Mr. Hritz tried and on the third attempt he finally got it in place. Father Sevcik stood on the steps of the rectory watching and when the cross was finally in place he made the sign of the cross and walked into the rectory. (excerpt from Parish History documents)

From the Pastor's Pen
Celebrating Everyday Saints

All Saints Day is a solemn holy day of the Catholic Church celebrated annually on November 1. The day is dedicated to the saints of the Church, that is, all those who have attained heaven, including saints who are recognized by the Church and those who are not. The day's feast honors the obscure as well as the famous – the saints each of us have known. Pope Francis has stressed that what today's Church needs above all, is everyday saints. The Pope stresses that these "everyday" and "close" individuals are the "lifeblood of the Church. It is they who make the Church move forward; those who bear witness to the fact that Jesus is risen, that he is alive; and they do so by leading coherent lives with the Holy Spirit they have received as a gift. They are men and women who put into practice the love of Jesus." The everyday saints, he has said, are the sick who offer their suffering for the Church and for others, they are the elderly who pray for others and the many moms and dads who keep their families going in the midst of struggle, raising their children, working, facing problems, but always with hope in Jesus. We are all called to holiness and to sainthood – maybe not canonized, maybe not recognized by the universal Church-but saints nevertheless. Through the grace of the Holy Spirit we can turn even our smallest acts of love into examples of Christ's love. That is what saints do, they witness. All Saints Day celebrates the holy men and women of past generations and those who are today's everyday saints in the making.
