Deacon's Corner

Peace be with you. Solidarity – “an eminently Christian virtue. It practices the sharing of spiritual goods even more than material ones.” CCC1948

In today's readings we focus on “Solidarity” with the first reading and the Gospel emphasizing solidarity in the family and in the second reading in the Letters to the Hebrews we focus on solidarity of Jesus and each one of us.

In the solidarity of the family in the Sacrament of Marriage we are reminded by Archbishop Fulton Sheen that “It takes three to get married: the husband, the wife, and God.” Without all three there is no true Sacrament of Marriage.

We are brothers in Christ, through our baptism we became his brothers and sisters. Our solidarity with him in the Body of Christ, the Church calls all of us to live out our faith in service to Him and to all.

For those who still have not completed your stewardship card and for those who have but did not add anything new, I ask that you take this time in prayer, open your hearts to be moved by the sacrifice of our Lord and in solidarity with him and your brothers and sisters, sign up to help in the liturgy, be active in prayer and participation by taking a role in the liturgy of the Mass.
