St. Leo the Great, Pope and Doctor of the Church - November 10

Leo's growth to sainthood has its basis in the spiritual depth with which he approached the pastoral care of his people. He is known for his spiritually profound sermons. An instrument of the call to holiness, well-versed in Scripture and ecclesiastical awareness, Leo had the ability to reach the everyday needs and interests of his people. It is said of Leo that his true significance rests in his doctrinal insistence on the mysteries of Christ and the Church and in the supernatural charisms of the spiritual life given to humanity in Christ and in his Body, the Church. Thus Leo held firmly that everything he did and said as pope for the administration of the Church represented Christ, the head of the Mystical Body, and Saint Peter, in whose place Leo acted.

The Pastor's Workshop

This coming week from this Sunday evening through Thursday I will be on **retreat** with many of my fellow priests from the Archdiocese. Typically, there are about 35 priests that spend the time at the White House in South County, overlooking the Mississippi River. I will pray for all of you, and ask that you do so for me as well. Silence can be good for the soul.

I have been asked to regularly assist the **Bonne Terre Correctional Center** by saying Mass for those in prison some Tuesday's of the month (yet to be finalized). The prison, a mile from church, is part of our St. Joseph parish, and so understandably part of our apostolate. A parish is many things.....sometimes a PSR, sometimes a Food Pantry, sometimes a Sunday congregation.....it can also be a prison. One is reminded of the *corporal works of mercy*, Feed the hungry, Give drink to the thirsty, Clothe the naked, Shelter the homeless, Visit the sick, **Visit the imprisoned**, Bury the dead. And so we pray for and with the hundreds of individuals in the state prison.

Finally just a gentle reminder that if you come to church with a friend who is not Catholic, please remind them beforehand that there is no regular **inter communion** in the Catholic church. Rather communion (host or precious blood) is reserved for Catholics. If you don't it puts the priest, deacon, or Eucharistic minister in an awkward position. I've had more than a few episodes of people of other faiths in the communion line and putting their hands out like everyone, or more often just standing there like a deer in the headlights, when the words 'The Body of Christ' or 'The Blood of Christ' are pronounced. Communion is more than just an expression of general fellowship or a symbol, it is belief, '**Amen**', that the Blessed Sacrament is really the Body and Blood of Christ, as well as the institutional Church being 'the Body of Christ'. I certainly don't want to stop anyone from coming forward.....but in those cases I will give them a blessing if requested.
